5:15 Closing Ceremony.....*Friendship Circle*

Friendship Circle Everyone gathers in a circle where they cross their right arm over their left in front of them and hold hands with the people on either side. Once everyone is silent, the leaders start the **friendship squeeze** which is passed from hand to hand. The girls will put their right foot out into the circle when they receive the friendship squeeze, so that everyone can see it travel along the circle. It stands for friendship with Girl Scouts everywhere. Once everyone has felt the squeeze everyone turns to the right under their right arms never letting go hands until they are facing out.
